# FAQ

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- 1. Will protective clothing be provided?** We will provide you with gloves and a plastic apron but after that we suggest you wear old clothing or bring your own overalls. Comfortable footwear that you don't mind getting dirty is advised.
- 2. Will there be a chance to be involved?** Yes we will provide scalpels and if you wish at appropriate times you will be able to dissect certain areas of the horse.
- 3. Will there be seating provided?** Seating will be provided at lunch time and you are free to step away from the dissection at any time if you need to rest but there will be no seating provided in the dissection room.
- 4. Can I take photos?** You can take photos for your own personal use but as they can often be mis-interrupted on social media we ask you not to share any outside of the dissection.
- 5. Will photo's be taken on the day?** Yes we will have someone on site taking both photo's and videos throughout the day which will then be shared in the dissection group, if there is something specific you would like please make sure you let them know.
- 6. Will food be provided?** Yes we will provide tea/coffee and biscuits which will be available throughout the day and lunch will also be available.
- 7. Will the smell be bad?** Some people are more sensitive to smell than others and for the most part the smell will not be bad but at some stages of the dissection the smell may be a little off putting. We will provide nose plugs and masks but advise individuals to bring their own Vicks VapoRub.
- 8. Can I ask specific questions?** Yes we encourage you to get involved in the dissection and your experiences/opinions are valuable. We do ask that you be respectful of everyone in the room and ensure that everyone get the chance to speak.
- 9. What if there is something specific I would like to see?** Please let us know and as much as possible we will try to achieve this.
- 10. I have an under 16 minor who would like to attend is this possible?** Yes we love younger students who take an interest but you will need to remain on site while they are with us.
- 11. How many people will be attending?** To ensure that everyone has visibility of the dissection the maximum number of people we will be taking bookings from is 30
- 12. Will I be able to hear everything clearly?** Becks will be wearing a microphone and we will also have several other Equi-Ed professionals there that you can ask questions of.
- 13. What types people attend these dissections?** We have a range of professionals from body workers to saddle fitters to fitters as well as interested owners attend our dissections.
